Finding Unexpected Joy

At dinner with my sons recently, I couldn't help but notice a table just a few feet away where an older couple sat. They must have been in their 80s, much older than anyone else in the restaurant. The restaurant was loud. The woman would say something to the man. He would shake his head. She would pick up her iPhone (the large one) and talk into it, then show him what she had dictated. He would laugh or smile or nod. And they continued this way through dinner, dessert and coffee. The most intriguing thing about this couple though was the way her face lit up every time she looked at him. You could tell that she enjoyed every interaction. I could see the delight on her face. You couldn't miss the affection. In fact, I noticed that others were also captivated by the sight. Waiters would pause as they walked by. Diners kept sneaking glances at the couple. There was something so wonderful, and at the same time unusual, in the pure joy we all were witnessing. We were fascinated by their connection to each other.

Interestingly, I had been talking to a friend earlier that day about a new nonprofit that consisted simply of a program designed to be run without people - a technology system connecting one group with another group. There's no staff to manage the program, no "overhead," so to speak. It's supposed to operate on its own. Will it work? I'm skeptical, because I think we still need people.

I believe those of us in the restaurant were so taken with this couple, because we sometimes forget the power of human connection. As the world around us simplifies and streamlines and gets people out of the way, we actually miss what we've pushed aside. It is human nature to want connection.

The success of Compass is that we run a personal program. We meet in person with each nonprofit that applies for a project. We personally interview all of our Project Leaders. We provide in-person trainings. Our volunteers meet their client and see their work first-hand. Our teams meet to do the work and brainstorming that happens best in person. We know that this human interaction is the key to successful Compass projects.

We also know that connections drive our clients. The nonprofits that work with Compass do the work they do, because of the people they serve. Their gift is supporting the individuals and families in their communities. Compass' gift is supporting nonprofits, and as a result, the people and communities they serve.

In this season of giving, I hope you will remember the nonprofits that are doing so much good in our local communities. And I hope you'll consider a gift to Compass as well, which is truly a gift to many nonprofits. We in turn will continue to give the gift of interaction, talent, skills, and caring, because there is no substitute for human connection.
