THE GIFT OF COMPASS

The text from my son that read, "How was your day?" was in response to my text asking the same of him. "It was GOOD," I responded. My mind went immediately to an hour-long phone call that afternoon with a long-time Compass volunteer, donor, and founding Compass board member. We had scheduled the call so I could update him on happenings at Compass. As always, I got so much from talking to him. "I don't think this is the time to put your head down," he advised. And, "That sounds like a lot of ideas at once. Have you done a business plan?" He immediately offered to review a draft plan we'd been working on. He listened and gave polite advice that I knew came from someone who had built a successful business and had years of experience. He also knows and cares about Compass, making his advice particularly helpful. Interestingly, earlier in the day, I'd been editing a grant proposal that had been reviewed by one of my most experienced board members. Her suggestions made my work more efficient and productive, and the final product ended up much better than the original. Both of these people gave generously of their time and expertise. While helpful to Compass, ultimately I felt their gifts personally. Yes, my day was GOOD.

I realized that evening as I responded to the text from my son that, in fact, I had had the day that Compass clients get all the time - the undistracted attention of people who care. Attention from individuals who not only have time that my day doesn't seem to offer, but valuable experience and expertise as well. This, I know, is the gift of Compass. This is what our clients love most.

Right now, 208 business professionals are volunteering on 23 Compass projects in Greater Washington. In January, we will kick off another 30+ consulting projects with more than 150 volunteers. All of these nonprofits will experience what I experienced. Talking to someone who really listens. Learning from expertise that may not otherwise be available. Receiving an objective, outside perspective. Knowing that someone else cares deeply about their organization.
