Letter from the President & CEO



20 YEARS OF IMPACT

I'm still in awe of Compass after leading the organization for 14 years and seeing Compass' impact over the past 20 years! Listening to our nonprofit clients speak about their work still moves me. It's an honor to work with them. When our volunteers talk about their experience at Compass, I'm amazed at the many ways Compass impacts them personally and professionally. I'm full of gratitude to all those who donate to Compass, which allows us to deliver our services. And finally, I watch in wonder as Compass employees pull out all the stops to ensure that our nonprofit clients and volunteers have a successful and enjoyable experience.

The last year challenged us all. With the pandemic continuing into Compass' 2020-21 projects, the Compass team turned our highly personal, in-person program into a highly personal, virtual program. The results surprised us. 97% of clients said they received a high-quality consulting product, while 100% valued the Compass experience!

Everyone stepped up in incredible ways. Our donors supported us with essential contributions. Our volunteers provided support to their Compass clients beyond a consulting deliverable. Through our team-based Classic and Micro Projects, Compass supported 93 nonprofits in 2020-21. Through our COVID-response On Demand Projects, we connected 106 nonprofits each with an individual consultant. At the same time, the Sorkin Center at Compass moderated nine Compass Connect Conversations and piloted a cohort for 23 nonprofit leaders serving children and youth. We also matched 36 people onto 33 nonprofit boards, because if there is ever a time that requires the best from nonprofit boards, this is it. Together, we helped our communities navigate forward.

This Annual Report showcases Compass' impact over the past year. We want to let you know how much of a difference you made in your community through Compass.

This fall, Compass reached the 20-year mark! For 20 years, nonprofits have turned to Compass for support and guidance. And for 20 years, we've provided pro bono consulting and more to advance local nonprofits. We have engaged more than 4,300 business professionals as volunteers. We have become integral to the communities we serve, and we plan to serve even more communities over the next 20 years.

Thank you to our donors, partners, volunteers, and clients for inspiring us each and every year. We are incredibly grateful!





OVERVIEW

The Sorkin Center for Nonprofit Governance honors the legacy of the late Jerry Sorkin, a former executive at CEB, now Gartner. His passion for supporting nonprofits and giving back through board service continues to inspire current and future leaders.

Established in 2017, the Sorkin Center supports and strengthens nonprofit boards and leaders through services that include:

- Matching business professionals to nonprofits seeking to strengthen and diversify their boards
- Providing board trainings for nonprofit board members, Executive Directors, and individuals considering board service
- Convening nonprofit leaders to address current challenges
- Educating and supporting the nonprofit community on timely topics
- Facilitating board retreats
- Delivering strategic planning consulting

ON BOARD

The Sorkin Center's board matching program, On Board, strengthens nonprofits by facilitating the matching of business professionals to their boards. Nonprofit board service enables candidates to give back to their local community on a substantive level along with providing leadership and professional development opportunities. This year, 36 candidates were placed on the boards of nonprofits in Greater Washington and Greater Philadelphia, bringing total placements to over 200 since the start of the program in 2014.

ANNUAL SORKIN SUMMIT

The fourth annual Sorkin Summit was held in May 2021. The Summit offered trainings on Governance, Nonprofit Finance, the Board's Role in Fundraising, and Establishing and Supporting a Diverse and Inclusive Board. The two half-day sessions started with keynote addresses from Tom Monahan, President & CEO, DeVry University, and Juan Otero, Vice President of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion at Comcast.
